What's going on in the classroom...Multiple Intelligences

- 1. Linguistic Intelligence... Book reports, creating narratives-ELA and they can present and illustrate, and parts of speech through songs, jingles and performances
- 2. Spatial intelligence... picture smart, designing classroom maps, examine pictures and photos of book being read in class, visualization with sketches to increase comprehension
- 3. Musical intelligence... Raps for math, parts of speech album-ELA, music class, music videos are available to watch on google classroom
- 4. Naturalist intelligence...nature smart... outdoor education, reading, science, art, music; outdoor classroom all subjects when the weather improves
- 5. Bodily and Kinesthetic intelligence.... Motions-help kids remember reading literary elements, whole brain learning...using both sides of the brain instead of just one, through dance, kids teach each other
- 6. Interpersonal intelligence.... Group work option, whole brain learning happens when you are forced to work with others
- 7. Intrapersonal Intelligence...self-smart... Independent folders in cultures, math, ELA (English language arts), independent work option
- 8. Logical mathematical intelligence...Number smart... board games, math, ELA, puzzles, counting and number games, money ball, money bingo

Projects.... Kids fill out a survey to see what their greatest intelligence is and they choose a project based on that. Kids have designated time to work on it in class or they can work on it when they complete other work earlier. They present on it at the end of the year.
